KEY MESSAGES

From meeting held on Thursday 2nd May 2019

- Good Practice Case Studies: Three case studies presented from Partner
 Agencies highlighting good practice and evidence of coordinated multi-agency
 collaborative working. NISB had previously commented that good practice
 should be showcased examples have been collected via the Practice Delivery
 Groups and aim is to agenda case studies from all partners on a regular basis
 for Board. Will also be using examples in Boards Annual Report.
- Basic Safeguarding Training for Commissioned Services:
 The Workforce Development and Training Group have been focusing on the Training Needs Analysis covering all sectors and agencies and some initial findings around the TNA highlighted a difference in access to training for commissioned services, residential and domiciliary care.
- The National Protection Procedures will be launched on 11th November 2019.
 In response to the request from the Welsh Government, the NWSB is currently
 undertaking a training needs audit, to identify how many multi-agency
 practitioners will need access to direct face to face training within the first four
 months of the launch of the National Safeguarding Procedures.
- The Work of the Office of the Public Guardian Presentation delivered to Board on the OPG Organisational awareness survey results – health and social sector. Background was given on the work of the OPG and discussed the results of the survey. General themes showed that the majority of respondents would find more training useful – particularly face to face or e-learning.
- Overview presented to Board of the Mental Capacity (Amendment) Bill which was approved by Parliament on 24 April 2019, meaning it will become law shortly, when it receives Royal Assent.
